Sarcomas are cancers that develop from bones or soft tissues, such as fat, muscles, nerves, and more. Because bone and soft tissues can be found nearly everywhere in the body, a sarcoma can start in any part of the body. Both children and adults can develop a sarcoma. It is rare, accounting for about 1% of all adult cancers.



However, sarcomas represent about 15% of all childhood cancers. Although rare, there are approximately 17,000 new cases of sarcoma diagnosed each year in the United States. In its 39th year of honoring the nation's most elite high school athletes, Gatorade today announced Virginia DYB alumni Dalton Wentz of Amherst County High School is the 2023-24 Gatorade Virginia Baseball Player of the Year. Wentz is the first Gatorade Virginia Baseball Player of the Year to be chosen from Amherst County High School.

Dalton maintained a 4.41 weighted GPA in the classroom. He has signed a National Letter of Intent to play baseball on scholarship at the University of South Carolina this fall, but is projected as an early round selection in July's Major League Baseball First Year Player Draft.
